Day 1: Safe Medication Prescribing of Opioids & Other Controlled Substances: To Include Pain Management

One needs to remain proactive and enhance the perspective on what the problem is to what systems or processes allowed the problem to occur and then focusing on correcting the systems or processes. This training will provide the tenets of patient safety/risk management in ambulatory settings and how the areas of patient safety, risk management, FTCA, and quality intertwine as well as resources to help you move forward.
